Terms and Conditions of entry to Ring of Kerry Charity Cycle 2026

The Terms and Conditions detailed below apply to all participants in the charity cycle event organised and operated by Ring Of Kerry Charity Cycle Limited (the "ROKCC"). By registering for the event, all cyclists acknowledge their acceptance of and adherence to the Terms and Conditions outlined herein.

1. The cyclist acknowledges that the annual ROKCC event is primarily a fundraising cycle benefiting various charities rather than a timed event or competitive race. The cyclist also recognises the significance of fully adhering to all rules of the road while cycling and, importantly, shows respect to fellow cyclists, other road users, marshals, stewards, and the many volunteers present to support and encourage them along the route. Any cyclist deemed to be competing against others, riding dangerously, or behaving offensively will be barred from participating in the event.
2. The online event registration system, powered by Njuko.com, must be completed and submitted by an individual aged 18 years or older. Evidence of age and/or proof of identity may be requested at bicycle tag distribution or at any time during the event itself. Cyclists under 18 are not permitted to participate in the cycle.
3. The basic entry fee for the event is €100, plus a 4% handling charge per cyclist. This handling charge covers Stripe payment processing fees, fees imposed by Njuko.com, our registration partner, and contributes to the ROKCC personal accident insurance cover; see clause 10 below.
4. Once your registration is complete, merchandise will be available for purchase. You will be redirected to the ROKCC Cycle Shop <https://rokcycleshop.com>, where you can buy ROKCC official merchandise from a third party.
5. You can also donate to the ROKCC or to one of its other beneficiary charities during registration. The 4% handling fee does not apply to donations.
6. The ROKCC enforces a strict **NO REFUND** policy on registration fees and donations, as well as any related handling charges. Therefore, each cyclist understands and accepts that this applies in all circumstances, including but not limited to injury, illness, weather-related issues, and/or scheduling conflicts.
7. The ROKCC event will commence in **Killarney between 6:30 am and 9:00 am** on Saturday, 4th July 2026. All cyclists must start in Killarney during this time frame. Should you start at any other location, this will invalidate your registration, as well as any associated insurances and support services that would ordinarily be provided to those starting in Killarney.
8. At 8:00 p.m. in Killarney, the ROKCC event is deemed **completed**, and any remaining cyclists on the route will be picked up by one of the official ROKCC sweep vehicles. If you refuse to comply with the sweep vehicle advice and/or assistance and continue cycling, you do so at your own risk, and all your insurance coverage will be invalidated.

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9. Participation in the event is at the cyclist's own risk. Insurance cover is provided for all cyclists against third-party claims arising from accidental damage to third-party property while participating in the event, provided that the cyclist has taken part in accordance with **Clauses 7 and 8** above. However, this insurance cover is adjudged void if it is deemed that the cyclist has acted negligently or is not registered.
10. Limited personal accident insurance cover is also provided for all registered cyclists who participate in accordance with **Clauses 7 and 8** above. The key benefits of this cover are as follows:
- i. €75,000 in case of death.
 - ii. €75,000 for loss of two or more Limbs or Eyes or one of each
 - iii. €75,000 for loss of one Limb or Eye
 - iv. €75,000 for total loss of speech
 - v. €75,000 for complete loss of hearing in both ears or €22,500 for loss of hearing in one ear.
 - vi. €75,000 for Permanent Total Disablement from any and all forms of gainful employment.
 - vii. €100 per week for a maximum period of 104 weeks for Temporary Total Disablement from gainful employment of any and every kind. This benefit is not payable for the first 14 days of any period of disablement.
 - viii. €3,500 for Medical expenses necessarily incurred in the treatment of the insured person.

It is, however, strongly recommended that each cyclist organises their own personal insurance cover.

11. The ROKCC reserves the right to change start times, implement wave starts, require cyclists to maintain social distancing, mandate the use of masks in specific locations, or impose any other restrictions for the sake of cyclist safety and in compliance with government recommendations and public health guidelines.
12. It is forbidden for any cyclist to allow another cyclist to ride the event on their behalf unless they have completed the registration transfer process, which is free of charge. To do this, simply click on the edit link in your confirmation email and select "**Transfer my registration to a friend**". If you choose to transfer your registration, it is your responsibility to seek a refund, for no more than face value, from your friend; the ROKCC will not be involved in this refund process. Should a cyclist be unable to participate in the event for any reason, you should inform the ROKCC by email at office@rokcc.ie.
13. Each cyclist is entirely responsible for their actions while attending and participating in the event. This responsibility extends to food stop centres and throughout the cycling route itself. The ROKCC does not accept responsibility for the actions of any cyclist, whether negligent or otherwise, and furthermore does not accept any liability for loss or damages, whether consequential or otherwise, caused by the cyclist.
14. Upon registration, each cyclist agrees that they are physically and mentally capable of riding the Ring of Kerry route and have completed sufficient training in advance of the event. If they decide to change their route during the event, all consequences of this action are theirs and theirs alone.

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15. The rules of the road apply and must be obeyed at all times. Cyclists should remain on the left-hand side, not crossing the white line, and use hand signals as needed. Cyclists should also cycle in single file or no more than two abreast at all times.
16. All cyclists must wear a safety-approved helmet complying with the latest EN1078, ANSI Z90/4, or SNELL standards. Any cyclist not wearing a helmet will be stopped from participating in the event. The ROKCC reserves the right to refuse entry to the event to anyone with inappropriate equipment or clothing.
17. The cyclist confirms that the bicycle they are using for the event and all their equipment are of a suitable standard and in a state of roadworthiness. Cyclists must also carry a spare tube or puncture repair kit. The ROKCC is not liable for any assistance or repair work conducted by volunteers at the cyclist's request.
18. During the event, warning signs and checkpoints will be placed at appropriate locations along the route. The absence of these signs does not signal that dangers are not approaching, and it is the individual cyclist's responsibility to exercise due care and caution, particularly in adverse weather conditions, on uneven surfaces, on windy roads, and/or on steep descents.
19. Wristbands and bicycle tags must always be present on both the cyclist and the bicycle. They are necessary for gaining entry to official stops, accessing sections of closed roads, and ensuring health and safety in the event of an accident or incident.
20. Please be mindful of your fellow cyclists and other road users. Some road closures will be in effect on the day, but the cycle will not be a closed-road event. Always signal your intention to stop or change direction. All cyclists must show reasonable courtesy to other road users. Please note that safety vehicles and ROKCC-approved cars will be travelling on closed roads.
21. ROKCC reserves the right to alter the published route or stop the event at any time in the event of an accident.
22. Each cyclist shall bear full responsibility for any fees or costs incurred as a result of an accident involving or caused by them. This includes, but is not limited to, ambulance, fire, and other rescue service charges.
23. Each cyclist grants the ROKCC an exclusive, absolute, and irrevocable worldwide assignment in perpetuity for the photographs, films, videos, and electronic representations and/or sound recordings of the cyclist obtained at the event. Furthermore, each cyclist grants the ROKCC the right to use and publish such content across all media. The cyclist releases the ROKCC from any and all liability concerning such use and promotion. This is subject to the ROKCC privacy policy.
24. If a participant fails to complete the full Ring of Kerry cycle, every effort will be made to arrange transportation back to the start line, but this will be coordinated in groups rather than individually.

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25. The ROKCC reserves the right to cancel the cycle due to government or public health guidelines, severe adverse weather conditions, a significant accident or incident, or other force majeure circumstances. In such cases, each cyclist's registration fee will be automatically transferred to the rescheduled event. Any voluntary donations made will be allocated to the cyclist's chosen charity rather than deferred to the rescheduled event.
26. Cyclists are asked to follow all instructions by Marshals, Stewards, and volunteers on the day. The use of headphones, earphones, and mobile phones while cycling is forbidden.
27. Cyclists are expected to respect the environment and not drop or leave litter on any part of the route. Litter should be disposed of responsibly at the appropriate locations. Any cyclist found littering will be stopped from participating in the cycle.
28. Cyclists are expected to respect the roads, towns, and countryside they travel through. This is a working landscape and home to many communities. Cyclists stopping for a comfort break are asked to use the facilities provided at the food stops and along the route and not to offend local residents or other cyclists.
29. Cyclists are accountable for the safety and security of their own bicycles. The ROKCC does not bear any liability for damage or theft of bicycles.
30. Each cyclist accepts that the Ring of Kerry Charity Cycle may not be used to raise funds for charities other than those nominated by the ROKCC.
31. Each cyclist understands and acknowledges that personal details must be provided to the ROKCC to facilitate event registration, in accordance with our privacy policy. This information includes name, address, email address, telephone contact number, emergency contact details, date of birth, and payment information.
32. Each cyclist understands and acknowledges that certain personal details will be shared by the ROKCC with the cyclist's chosen charity and iDonate, our online fundraising partner. They will use this information for communication and fundraising purposes related to your participation and representation of that charity in the ROKCC event, including fundraising activities undertaken on their behalf. This is subject to the ROKCC privacy policy.
33. Each cyclist understands and acknowledges that it is their responsibility and obligation, when registering another cyclist, to inform that individual of the Terms & Conditions accepted on their behalf.
34. The ROKCC Privacy Policy details the usage and storage of participant data collected, and the policy can be found at www.ringofkerrycycle.ie.
35. The ROKCC's pandemic mitigation policy means that any restrictions implemented may result in different requirements at various times. Ultimately, public health guidelines will govern the policy and procedures for the ROKCC event. By registering for the event, the cyclist agrees to comply with whatever policies and procedures are in place regarding a Pandemic situation, should that arise.
